If you're reading this, chances are you're already hooked – or about to be – on the incredible world of mantrailing. Whether you're here for fun, to build your dog's confidence, or simply to enjoy the outdoors while learning a pretty amazing skill together, this logbook is your trusty trail companion.

Mantrailing is the art of training dogs to follow a specific person's scent trail. It's instinctive, fun, and totally addictive (you've been warned!).

It's about building a partnership, having fun, and maybe geeking out a little about scent theory, trails, and your dog's incredible nose.

How to Use This Log Book

- Each trail variation should be completed 4 times successfully before going for the assessment trail.
- Trails are split into 6 levels.
- Use the trail log pages to record the details of each session.
- Sign-off pages help track your dog's consistent performance.

Success isn't about perfection - it's about progress and fun. If a trail doesn't go to plan, it's not a fail - it's feedback.

Kernow Mantrailing Levels

Level 1 - White

100m straight trail100m with 1 turn150m with 2 turns and the introduction of an obstacle

Level 2 - Yellow

300m 2 turns 100m complex start 300m complex start, 3 turns Scent line up

Level 3 - Blue

500m complex start 100m walking misper Split trail 300m fresh Urban Trail to misper in groups Displaced start

Level 4 - Green

600m - 800m complex start
Trail with misper behind a door
Trail misper in clear view
Trail misper off ground
200m aged trail
Take scent from solid item

Level 5 - Red

1000m complex start 300m complex start aged Urban 500m 2 road crossing fresh urban, double blind

Level 6 - Orange

600m complex start, road crossing, through building distraction, double blind
No scent exercise
Car pick up
Buried misper
Scent elimination
